Happisburgh (C of E) VA Primary School

Brass Instrument Training.

A long-term schools music training scheme for children living in the Stalham area.

A limited number of places are available for pupils to learn to play a brass instrument [cornet, tenor horn, euphonium, baritone etc] in the context of a brass band.



A minimum of 6 pupils must be on the scheme at each participating school.

The scheme is organised by Stalham Brass Band.

Tuition is free and an instrument is provided on free loan to each pupil who secures and retains a place on the scheme. Each child's bursary is worth up to £850 per year.

The scheme is intended to help the community by training young musicians to eventually join the Stalham Brass Band as full members and contribute to the life of their community.

It also gives them an opportunity in team building and community involvement. Music also helps young people with attainment in their other academic subjects.

The scheme will begin with lessons during school time, progressing to after-school activities. Those who reach the required standard will then become trainees with the Stalham Brass Band, training on Tuesday nights in Happisburgh village.
